

**Sunday School 5th and up Walk to Emmaus
April 26th**

Review the events of Holy Week and Easter. What happened on Easter morning? Who first saw Jesus? Did everyone see Jesus at the same time? Do you think there were still disciples who hadn't seen Jesus yet?

Read from the Bible Luke 24:13-35 from the attached story Bible.

- Do you think that Jesus really didn't know what had happened the past three days? Why do you think he pretended not to know what had happened? (there is no right or wrong answer – what do you think?)
- How do you know that Jesus is always with you? Give three examples.
- What day did the Walk to Emmaus happen on?
- Why were there only 11 disciples instead of 12? Can't remember? Look at Luke 22:47-48
- What is the name of one of the people that was walking the road to Emmaus with Jesus?
- Who had Jesus already appeared to before the walk to Emmaus happened?
- What did Jesus teach his companions about on the walk to Emmaus?
- How many miles did the 2 who walked to Emmaus end up walking by the end of the day?
- In hard times, how do you see Jesus "walking" with you in your life? List 4-5 things. Hint: think of things you are thankful for.

Art Project:

Using a long piece of paper/cardboard/whatever you have, make a road and add the following to it in any way you choose:

- Cleopas and his companion and Jesus
- Label Jerusalem and Emmaus
- Add any plants/animals you might find in a hilly, dry desert
- Along the road, write words that describe how Jesus "walks" with us every day, even though we can't see Him. For example, I would write on my road words like family, friends, mountains, giraffes, hope, love, etc.
