

## Second Reading

2 Peter 3:8-15a

Do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day. The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to repentance. But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and everything that is done on it will be disclosed.

Since all these things are to be dissolved in this way, what sort of persons ought you to be in leading lives of holiness and godliness, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set ablaze and dissolved, and the elements will melt with fire? But, in accordance with his promise, we wait for new heavens and a new earth, where righteousness is at home.

Therefore, beloved, while you are waiting for these things, strive to be found by him at peace, without spot or blemish; and regard the patience of our Lord as salvation.

## The Gospel

Mark 1:1-8

## Formation and Fellowship

**Adult Forum during Advent, Sunday, 10am:** Join Rev. Rob Banse as topics relevant to the Advent season are discussed this month. Each discussion will "stand alone" so that you may take part in one or all of the discussions. Everyone is welcome to join in! **Sunday, December 6th:** "*Christ will come again.*" We tend to think of Advent as the season in which we prepare for the celebration of Christmas. This is certainly true. However, an equally important theme running throughout the four weeks is Jesus' promise that, at the appointed time, he will return in order to fulfill the coming of God's kingdom. What does that mean? Our conversation will be about "end times" and greeting "with joy the coming of Jesus Christ our Redeemer." **Sunday, December 13th:** "*Keep Awake!*" Watchfulness is also an important Advent theme. How do we best stay alert in these "days in between?" There is so much that clambers for our attention and distracts us. There are a lot of idols out there! What disciplines are available to us to ensure that we don't miss the presence of the living Christ? **Sunday, December 20th:** "*Waiting.*" This third Advent theme is a real challenge for us in our impatient day and age. How do we learn to wait patiently on the Lord and the hope, peace, love, and joy that he promises? Join us via Zoom.
