

## Second Reading

2 Corinthians 6:1-13

As we work together with Christ, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says,

“At an acceptable time I have listened to you,  
and on a day of salvation I have helped you.”

See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see-- we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

We have spoken frankly to you Corinthians; our heart is wide open to you. There is no restriction in our affections, but only in yours. In return-- I speak as to children-- open wide your hearts also.

**Donations of Household Cleaning Supplies and Personal Care Products for Good Neighbors of Capitol Hill:** Christ Church has been a part of Good Neighbors Capitol Hill since its inception in 2016. Since that time, the coalition of 8 Capitol Hill congregations and unaffiliated friends have established nearly 60 homes for arriving refugees and asylum seekers. Whenever a new refugee family arrives, GNCH mobilizes to do what it takes to get the family settled. CC+WP has taken on the responsibility of providing cleaning supplies and personal care products for the family, items such as brooms, dust mops, detergent, wastebaskets, deodorant, toothpaste and toothbrushes, etc. During the month of June, we will be gathering these items in anticipation of the next family to arrive.
